Padho Bharat 2025:



A growing movement of books and hope

From one city to another, India is uniting to build libraries of learning

Padho Bharat is India Humanity Foundation's flagship literacy movement dedicated to collecting lakhs of books and creating thousands of libraries in underserved schools and communities across the country. Running from 8th August to 2nd October 2025, the campaign aims to establish over thousands of new libraries, building on IHF's legacy of setting up more than 5,000 libraries and distributing over 10,00,000 books to date. By mobilising individuals, institutions, and partners—including publishers, NGOs, corporate groups, and volunteers—the campaign transforms unused and gently used books into powerful tools of learning.

As we step into September, we are thrilled to share the inspiring progress of Padho Bharat 2025, a campaign that is fast becoming a people's movement. What began as a vision to collect lakhs of books and establish thousands of libraries is now being powered by individuals, organisations, and communities who believe in the power of knowledge. Padho Bharat is not just about bookshelves—it is about giving every child the chance to read, dream, and build a brighter future.

So far, nearly **2,00,000** books have been collected, bringing us closer to reaching underserved schools and communities. A landmark contribution came from Orient Blackswan, which generously donated **80,974** books at IHF's base in Kolkata.



From illiteracy to confidence:

Literacy opens doors for 10,700+ adults

For many adults across West Bengal, the idea of going back to school once seemed impossible. Yet today, thousands are discovering the joy of learning through India Humanity Foundation's Adult Literacy program, supported by Rotary Calcutta Mahanagar.

The initiative began with a simple promise to give non-literate adults the tools to read, write, and count with confidence. Across **three districts**, **10 dedicated NGO partners** are working hand in hand with communities, creating safe spaces where learners can pick up skills often taken for granted.





The response has been extraordinary. So far, 9,615 learners have completed 30 sessions, 8,882 have finished the full 60-session course, and 8,809 have even appeared for their final examinations. Behind these figures are powerful stories—women who now travel more confidently because they can read bus boards, men who proudly sign their names on official documents, and parents who finally help their children with homework.

What was once a distant dream has become reality. With every session completed, learners gain not just knowledge but dignity, independence, and a brighter vision for the future.

This movement is proof that it's never too late to learn—and never too late to change a life.

Shri Vivek Krishna Tankha

Champion of justice, service & social change



Shri Vivek Krishna Tankha is a renowned Senior Advocate of the Supreme Court of India, parliamentarian, and humanitarian whose life has been dedicated to justice, service, and the upliftment of society. Born on 21st September 1956 in Rewa, Madhya Pradesh, he is the son of Late Justice Raj Krishna Tankha, and has carried forward his father's legacy of fairness, compassion, and public service.



With over four decades of legal and governance experience, Shri Tankha has made notable contributions to the Indian judicial system. He has represented several landmark cases, including:

- Fighting for the survivors of the **Bhopal Gas Tragedy**
- Leading the cause of **transparency in the Vyapam case**
- Introducing the Common Law Admission Test (CLAT), opening doors for thousands of law aspirants.





Over the years, Mr. Tankha has held prestigious positions such as Advocate General of Madhya Pradesh and Additional Solicitor General of India. Today, he represents Madhya Pradesh in the Rajya Sabha, where his strong voice continues to shape discussions on law, governance, and social justice.





Beyond his legal and political career, Mr. Tankha's contribution to **humanitarian service** is remarkable. As a long-standing Rotarian, he has led **disaster relief missions** during some of India's worst crises, providing immediate support to affected communities. He pioneered the **RAHAT Medical Outreach Program**, bringing large-scale healthcare to underserved tribal populations in Madhya Pradesh and Chhattisgarh. This initiative alone has benefitted lakhs of people, including life-saving surgeries for thousands.





Equally close to his heart is the cause of children with special needs. Mr. Tankha is the guiding force behind the **Justice Tankha Memorial Rotary Institute for Special Children**, which today runs schools across Madhya Pradesh and Chhattisgarh, serving more than **700 children** with hearing impairments, autism, cerebral palsy, and other intellectual disabilities. His efforts have provided these children with education, dignity, and the opportunity to live fuller lives









A recipient of several National and International honours, Shri Vivek Tankha exemplifies leadership that blends professional excellence with deep compassion. His journey continues to inspire, and we are privileged to have him as a trustee and guiding light in the mission of India Humanity Foundation.



But Padho Bharat is not just about numbers—it's about people stepping forward. In Jabalpur, Madhya Pradesh, Advocate Shivendra Pandey has already collected 5,000 books, saying, "Every book I collect feels like a step towards shaping a brighter India." In Indore, Anushuman Shrivastav has mobilized his community and begun collections with great enthusiasm. In Delhi, City Leader Madhulika Jain has gathered more than 1,500 books so far, inspired by her childhood love of reading: "Books changed my life, and I want to pass that gift on."


Today, **70+ City Leaders** are driving book collection drives across India, with more joining every week. Together, they are proving that local action can build national change.



Serving humanity - Impact Stories

Learning that transforms lives:

1,315 empowered with the support of Tirupati Vancom



In 2024, India Humanity Foundation (IHF), with the generous support of Tirupati Vancom Pvt. Ltd., brought education and dignity to hundreds of underserved families in West Bengal. What began as a partnership soon turned into a life-changing movement for both adults and children long deprived of learning.

Empowering Adults through Vidya


Under the Vidya Adult Literacy Program, non-literate adults aged 15 and above were given a second chance at education. Through 60 structured sessions led by trained community teachers, learners mastered the basics of reading, writing, and numeracy. Assessments ensured progress, and successful participants proudly received certificates equivalent to Grade III.

By the end of 2024, **1,215 adults** across **South and North 24 Parganas** had completed the program. For many, signing their name or reading a newspaper for the first time became a milestone, boosting confidence and independence.

Building Futures through Asha Kiran

Alongside adult literacy, the **Asha Kiran** initiative brought **100 out-of-school children** in **Jalpaiguri district** back into classrooms. Through a **nine-month bridge course and mentoring**, they were successfully mainstreamed into **government schools**, opening brighter futures.

This impact was made possible through **Tirupati** Vancom's ₹7 lakh contribution, which supported both adult literacy centres and child development programs—restoring hope, dignity, and opportunity to 1,315 lives.



A new chapter in Naresh's life:

Turning struggle into strength

For 43 years, Naresh Majhi of Saraipada, Nuapada District, Odisha, lived without the ability to read or write. Having never attended school, he worked as a migrant labourer with his wife, Bimala, moving from place to place in search of wages.

His life changed when Mr. Bedram Sahu, a staff member of India Humanity Foundation's partner organisation PARDA, encouraged him to join the Vidya Adult Literacy Centre at Saraipada. Initially, Naresh planned to attend for just two weeks, but once he experienced the joy of learning, he continued regularly—two hours each day. Slowly, his skills and confidence grew, and he began reading and writing with ease.

The proudest moment came when Naresh received his literacy certificate. With newfound confidence, he opened his own savings account and began reading the Odia newspaper daily, sharing the news with his wife.

Naresh's story proves it's never too late—education with support empowers all ages, opening doors to dignity, confidence, and hope.


Three Ethiopian children get a second chance at life

In a powerful testament to compassion beyond boundaries, three children from Ethiopia have recently received lifesaving heart surgeries in India under the Saving Little Hearts program of the India Humanity Foundation (IHF). Their stories reflect both the fragility of life and the resilience that comes when care and hope are extended across nations. This milestone was made possible through the dedicated efforts of Mr. V. R. Muthu from Kerala and Mr. Rajeev Sharma from Ethiopia, whose commitment ensured that these young lives received the timely care they needed.

Nine-vear-old Marken Hareru Bekele was born with a serious congenital heart defect. His mother, Hana, recalls how feeding him as a toddler was always a struggle. In his recent years, condition worsened to the point that even simple activities left him breathless and his heart racing. With IHF's support, Marken and his mother travelled to the Amrita Institute of Medical Sciences, Cochin, Kerala, where on 17th August 2025 he underwent a successful corrective surgery.

One-year-old Alemayehu (Eza) Tekel, also born with a severe cardiac condition compounded by Syndrome, faced challenges. Her mother. Tsegaw Zinash noticed irregularities feeding and breathing within her first few months. Eza's fragile health made her case especially urgent. On 21st **August 2025**, she underwent a complex heart surgery at Amrita Institute. She is stable and recovering Alemayehu (Eza) Tekel steadily.

Seven-year-old **Efrata** Reta Kumsa, another child with Down Syndrome, had lived with cardiac issues since infancy. caretaker, Senayit, shared how breathlessness had become part of her daily Thanks to IHF's intervention, Efrata also underwent surgery Amrita Institute on 21st August 2025. Currently, she is under cervical traction, yet her cardiac health has greatly improved. Her caretaker calls this journey nothing short of miraculous.



These recoveries were made possible not only by the skill of doctors at Amrita Institute but also by the coordinated support provided through IHF.

As these three children prepare to return to Ethiopia, their stories remind us that healing has no borders. Through Saving Little Hearts, IHF continues to prove that every child, no matter where they are born, deserves the chance to grow, play, and dream of the future.


